You are encouraged to complete the memorization of as many of the 20 verses as you are able (with a minimum of 10 verses). Verify this number with your teacher.

At SCA, we highly value the planting of God's Word and Truth in our hearts. To establish a deeper relationship with God, we believe that Scripture meditation, memorization and the speaking of God's promises are essential.

With the above taken into consideration, the expectations for student Scripture memorization are about reflecting the Word that is in the student's heart. The reciting of verses should be accomplished with the proper syntax and interpretation of the Word, rather than a word-by-word representation. Substituted words/sections should reflect the actual intent of the passage. Prompts may be given should a student stall and be unable to complete a thought, as well as if a word is used that changes the meaning of the passage.

Please track and record the number of prompts and the verses accomplished during the recitation sitting. At the teachers' discretion, an excess number of prompts or an inability to recite the majority of the given Scriptures, may result in the student being asked to attempt the verses again.

Matthew 6: 5-13

5 "And when you pray, do not be like the hypocrites, for they love to pray standing in the synagogues and on the street corners to be seen by others. Truly I tell you, they have received their reward in full.

6 But when you pray, go into your room, close the door and pray to your Father, who is unseen. Then your Father, who sees what is done in secret, will reward you.

7 And when you pray, do not keep on babbling like pagans, for they think they will be heard because of their many words.

8 Do not be like them, for your Father knows what you need before you ask him.

9" This, then, is how you should pray: "Our Father in heaven, hallowed be your name,
10 your kingdom come, your will be done, on earth as it is in **heaven**.

11 Give us today our daily bread.

12 And forgive us our debts, as we also have forgiven our debtors.

13 And lead us not into temptation,
but deliver us from the evil one.'

Matthew 6:19-25

19 "Do not store up for yourselves treasures on earth, where moths and vermin destroy, and where thieves break in and steal.

20 But store up for yourselves treasures in heaven, where moths and vermin do not destroy, and where thieves do not break in and steal,

21 For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also.

22 "The eye is the lamp of the body. If your eyes are healthy, your whole body will be full of light.

23 But if your eyes are unhealthy, your whole body will be full of darkness. If then the light within you is darkness, how great is that darkness!

24 "No one can serve two masters. Either you will hate the one and love the other, or you will be devoted to the one and despise the other. You cannot serve both God and money

25 "Therefore I tell you, do not worry about your life, what you will eat or drink; or about your body, what you will wear. Is not life more than food, and the body more than clothes?

Matthew 6:31-34

31 So do not worry, saying, 'What shall we eat?' or 'What shall we drink?' or 'What shall we wear?'

32 For the pagans run after all these things, and your heavenly Father knows that you need them.

33 But seek first his kingdom and his righteousness, and all these things will be given to you as well.

34 Therefore do not worry about tomorrow, for tomorrow will worry about itself. Each day has enough trouble of its own.
