The Scripture Project is made up of three parts:

- **Memorize the Word** – set a goal for yourself regarding how many verses you would like to commit to memory and then consult with your teacher. (6,12,18, or 22 verses)
- **Reflect on the Word** - think about **ALL** of the verses and how they specifically apply to your life.
- **Interact with the Word** - use the verses to complete additional assignments
- All written portions are to be typed with a hard copy handed into the classroom and an uploaded copy to Google Classroom.
- All three sections of the Scripture Project must be completed by the deadline in order to qualify for a passing Grad in Bible 41G

Part 1: Memorize the Word

Decide how many of the verses you'd like to memorize and recite, (6, 12, 18, or 22) and have this amount approved by your teacher. Verses can be recited at school or at home. All selected verses must be recited in 1 sitting. A parent/guardian signature is required on the first page. All verses are NIV.

Fullness of Time, the Church is Born:

Galatians 4:3 - 5

3 So also, when we were underage, we were in slavery under the elemental spiritual forces of the world.

4 But when the set time had fully come, God sent his Son, born of a woman, born under the law, 5 to redeem those under the law, that we might receive adoption to sonship.

Matthew 28:18-20

18 Then Jesus came to them and said, "All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me.

19 Therefore go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit,

The Persecuted Church:

Revelation 2:9-11

To the Church in Smyrna

9 I know your afflictions and your poverty—yet you are rich! I know about the slander of those who say they are Jews and are not, but are a synagogue of Satan.

10 Do not be afraid of what you are about to suffer. I tell you, the devil will put some of you in prison to test you, and you will suffer persecution for ten days. Be faithful, even to the point of death, and I will give you life as your victor's crown.

11 Whoever has ears, let them hear what the Spirit says to the churches. The one who is victorious will not be hurt at all by the second death.

Defend Christianity:

1 Peter 3:13-16

13 Who is going to harm you if you are eager to do good?

14 But even if you should suffer for what is right, you are blessed. “Do not fear their threats; do not be frightened.”

15 But in your hearts revere Christ as Lord. Always be prepared to give an answer to every one who asks you to give the reason for the hope that you have. But do this with gentleness and respect,

16 keeping a clear conscience, so that those who speak maliciously against your good behaviour in Christ may be ashamed of their slander.

The Rise of Rome and the Papacy, Church Leadership:

1 Peter 5:2-3

To the Elders and the Flock

2 Be shepherds of God’s flock that is under your care, watching over them—not because you must, but because you are willing, as God wants you to be; not pursuing dishonest gain, but eager to serve;

3 not lording it over those entrusted to you, but being examples to the flock.

1 Peter 2:5-6

5 you also, like living stones, are being built into a spiritual house to be a holy priesthood, offering spiritual sacrifices acceptable to God through Jesus Christ.

6 For in Scripture it says:

“See, I lay a stone in Zion,
a chosen and precious cornerstone,
and the one who trusts in him
will never be put to shame.”

The Protestant Reformation, Justification by Faith:

Romans 1:16-17

16 For I am not ashamed of the gospel, because it is the power of God that brings salvation to everyone who believes: first to the Jew, then to the Gentile.

17 For in the gospel the righteousness of God is revealed—a righteousness that is by faith from first to last, just as it is written: “The righteous will live by faith.”

Part 2: Reflect on the Word

Think about the ALL of the project verses and how they apply to your life. Not just those that you have memorized and recited. Answer the following questions. Your answers MUST be personal, use “I”, “me”, “mine”, etc., not “us”, “we”, “our”. Be sure to include the letters A and B in your answer as you cover ALL of the project verses. All responses must be typed.

- **A)** What is your interpretation of the verses? What is God teaching? Indicate which verse or group of verses that you are specifically referring to.
- **B)** Give specific, personal examples as to how each of the individual verses or sections of verses apply to your life.

Part 3: Interact with the Word

YOUR CHOICE! Do as many activities as required in order to meet the expectation for this Scripture Project.

- 6 verses = 4 Interacts, 12 verses = 3 Interacts, 18 verses = 2 Interacts, 22 verses = 1 Interact
- Clearly indicate on your work which choice(s) you are doing. Do not combine choices.
- Each selection should be done independently of the others.
- An interact cannot be repeated. Eg: You can only do Interact #1 once.

1. **Research**, in your own words, the Biblical context of one of the verses.
 - Who wrote the verse, name and explain who they were.
 - When was the verse written?
 - To whom was it directed?
 - Give some background information as to why it was directed to this group.
 - Why is this verse important today?
 - Give specific personal examples. Include a bibliography
 - 1 Page, single spaced, 12 pt font.
2. Write new lyrics to an existing **song or rap** that highlight the key verses in this Scripture. Indicate the key individual scripture verses your new song lyrics are based on and explain how your lyrics are related.
3. Create an original piece of **artwork** based on this Scripture. Tell why you made the artistic choices you did and how they relate to the Scripture in a ½ page, single spaced, 12 pt font paper. Some examples of artwork are: a painting, a sketch, a play-doh figurine, a Lego creation, jewellery, sculpture (wood, metal, plastic), string art, a T-shirt design, etc.
4. Choose **10 key words from the Scripture**. Identify the Scripture verses that you have used as sources for the key words. Find the Greek or Hebrew derivative for each word and give the original meaning in your own words. How does knowing the original meaning of the word expand your understanding of the Scripture? Must be in your own words, 4-8 sentences each

5. Choose one of the verses and write your own **devotional** that includes the verse, commentary, including at least one other verse, and a prayer. The additional verse(s) must be different from those provided but still be based upon the section themes. Use Pastor Leon's *Devoted* devotional as a guideline. Do not just copy/paste from a pre-existing devotional. 1 page, single spaced
6. Read and write out the **Message Version** of these verses. Specifically refer to a minimum of 3 verses. How are the translations the same? Different? Make sure you included examples! Do you feel the Message version captures the essence of these verses? Why or why not? 1 page, single spaced.
7. Find a **song** that is the same theme as these verses. Identify the song title, artist and write out the lyrics. Why do you think it relates to this Scripture? What made this song stand out to you? 1 page, single spaced.
8. Find another **10 Scripture verses** that fit this theme. Type out the verse and the reference. How do you think each of the specific verses you chose fit the theme? The selected verses will be different from those that are provided with the Scripture Project and Scripture Memorization. 3-4 sentences per verse, single spaced.
9. Create a **media project** with sound and images to bring a new dimension to the Scripture. Tell why you chose the music and pictures that you did.
10. Write a **children's story**. Incorporate some verses and have a moral lesson based on this term's topic. Graphics must be included with colour.
11. Make a **suggestion** to the teacher, and get approval, for another way to interact with the Word.
