Prompts may be given should a student stall and be unable to complete a thought, as well as if a word is used that changes the meaning of the passage.

Please track and record the number of prompts and the verses accomplished during the recitation sitting. At the teachers’ discretion, an excess number of prompts or an inability to recite the majority of the given Scriptures, may result in the student being asked to attempt the verses again.

9 Things to Succeed in Love and Life

Romans 13:1-5 NLT (5 verses)

¹ Everyone must submit to governing authorities. For all authority comes from God, and those in positions of authority have been placed there by God.

² So anyone who rebels against authority is rebelling against what God has instituted, and they will be punished.

³ For the authorities do not strike fear in people who are doing right, but in those who are doing wrong. Would you like to live without fear of the authorities? Do what is right, and they will honor you.

⁴ The authorities are God's servants, sent for your good. But if you are doing wrong, of course you should be afraid, for they have the power to punish you. They are God's servants, sent for the very purpose of punishing those who do what is wrong.

⁵ So you must submit to them, not only to avoid punishment, but also to keep a clear conscience.

⁵ Get wisdom; develop good judgment. Don't forget my words or turn away from them.

⁶ Don't turn your back on wisdom, for she will protect you. Love her, and she will guard you.

Proverbs 19:20-21 NLT (2 verses)

²⁰ Get all the advice and instruction you can so you will be wise the rest of your life.

²¹ You can make many plans, but the LORD's purpose will prevail.

Psalms 1:1-3 NLT (3 verses)

¹ Oh, the joys of those who do not follow the advice of the wicked, or stand around with sinners, or join in with mockers.

² But they delight in the law of the LORD, meditating on it day and night.

³ They are like trees planted along the riverbank, bearing fruit each season. Their leaves never wither, and they prosper in all they do.
