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Grade 11 Scripture Project Theme: Relationships

This project is due Thursday October 19th, 2023

The Grade 11 Scripture Project is broken down into **three** parts:

- <u>Part 1: Reflect on the Word</u> Your reflection must summarize all verses in this project. Additionally, you must <u>directly mention at least 10 of the verses</u> in your reflection.
- Part 2: Interact with the Word You must complete two "interact with the word" assignments.
- Part 3: Volunteer Hours
 — You must complete 5 hours of volunteer work for this project. The volunteer sheet is attached to this project and must be submitted with your project. When submitting this tracking document, please upload a copy to your Google Doc. The original signed copy does not need to be submitted.

Project Submission Guidelines:

- The written components of your Scripture Project (<u>and</u> volunteer hours tracking sheet) must be submitted electronically via Google Docs.
- Please submit all work as <u>ONE GOOGLE DOC</u>. Your work should be organized and easy to follow.
- Ensure Mr. Lazaruk's permissions are adjusted to "commenter"
- Mr. Lazaruk will leave individual comments and feedback on your Google Doc.
 Any student who does not receive a "passing" mark will be notified and required to re-submit their work.
- There is **NO** requirement to hand in paper copies of your work. The only exception is non-written components that cannot be submitted electronically; these must be submitted as a hard copy to Mr. Lazaruk's "in-bin."
- To state the obvious, students must exercise academic honesty and integrity at all times. *Plagiarism, copying and use of ChatGPT* will <u>NOT</u> be tolerated.

The Verses for the Grade 11 Scripture Project — NIV

Ephesians 5:22-33 (NIV)

- ²² Wives, submit yourselves to your own husbands as you do to the Lord.
- ²³ For the husband is the head of the wife as Christ is the head of the church, his body, of which he is the Savior.
- ²⁴ Now as the church submits to Christ, so also wives should submit to their husbands in everything.
- ²⁵ Husbands, love your wives, just as Christ loved the church and gave himself up for her ²⁶ to make her holy, cleansing her by the washing with water through the word, ²⁷ and to present her to himself as a radiant church, without stain or wrinkle or any other blemish, but holy and blameless.
- ²⁸ In this same way, husbands ought to love their wives as their own bodies. He who loves his wife loves himself.
- ²⁹ After all, no one ever hated their own body, but they feed and care for their body, just as Christ does the church ³⁰ for we are members of his body.
- ³¹ "For this reason a man will leave his father and mother and be united to his wife, and the two will become one flesh."
- ³² This is a profound mystery but I am talking about Christ and the church.
- ³³ However, each one of you also must love his wife as he loves himself, and the wife must respect her husband.

Ecclesiastes 4:9-12 (NIV)

- ⁹ Two are better than one, because they have a good return for their labor:
- ¹⁰ If either of them falls down, one can help the other up. But pity anyone who falls and has no one to help them up.
- ¹¹ Also, if two lie down together, they will keep warm. But how can one keep warm alone?
- ¹² Though one may be overpowered, two can defend themselves. A cord of three strands is not quickly broken.

Matthew 5:39 - 42 (NIV)

- ³⁹ But I tell you, do not resist an evil person. If anyone slaps you on the right cheek, turn to them the other cheek also.
- ⁴⁰ And if anyone wants to sue you and take your shirt, hand over your coat as well.
- ⁴¹ If anyone forces you to go one mile, go with them two miles.
- ⁴² Give to the one who asks you, and do not turn away from the one who wants to borrow from you.



***PROJECT GUIL

Part 1: Reflect on the Word: "The Essay"

- You must read and summarize all verses in your reflection.
- Please note that while you do not need to specifically refer to every verse, you must directly mention at least 10 of the verses provided. It's your choice as to how and where you reference these verses in your reflection.
- Your reflection must be at least 1 page in length, appropriately spaced (1-point spacing) and typed on a word processor. Please use size 12, Times New Romans font.
- To help guide your writing, respond to each of the bullet points below in your reflection:
 - What is your interpretation of the verses? What is God teaching us?
 - Give specific, personal examples as to how these verses <u>apply to your life</u>. How can you apply these verses to your current or future relationships?

Part 2: Interact with the Word: "The Mini-Assignments"

- You must complete **two** "interact with the word" mini-assignments.
- Each project has specific requirements that must be met. Read the requirements carefully. Refer to page 4-5 for specific instructions for these mini-assignments. All work must reference the verses in the project.

Part 3: Volunteer Hours

- You must complete **5 hours** of volunteer work for this project.
- Your hours must be recorded on the tracking sheet and signed by the person responsible for overseeing your work. This person should not be a family member.
- Examples of volunteer opportunities: church ministry, extra school volunteer tasks, community events or activities, or helping at local charities. Volunteer hours cannot be recorded for family events, household chores, tasks that you are already responsible for completing or any work in which you are being paid.
- When **submitting this tracking sheet**, please upload a copy to your Google Doc. The original signed copy does not need to be submitted.

Part 2 "Interact with the Word" Mini-Assignments

- 1. Memorize all 20 verses and recite them to a parent, guardian or Mr. Lazaruk. Please note that a sibling cannot evaluate this task. The verses are found on page 2. You should recite these verses with as few interruptions, breaks or corrections as possible (please be reasonable). The verses must be recited in one sitting.
 - <u>Submission guidelines</u>: Indicate on your Google Doc submission that you completed this task. Then, the person evaluating this task must send Mr. Lazaruk an email verifying that this task was completed.
 - Email confirmation text: I [insert parent/guardian name] am writing to verify that [insert student name] recited all 20 verses, in one sitting, with minimal or no interruptions, breaks or corrections.
- 2. Write a "mini" research essay about the Biblical context of one of the verses. Please clearly identify which verse you've selected. In your mini-essay, you should comment on the following: Who wrote the verse? When was it written? To whom was it directed? Why is this verse still important today?
 - Requirements: Your mini-essay must be 1 page, appropriately spaced and formatted, size 12 font, Times New Romans.
- 3. Create new lyrics to an existing song or rap that highlight at least eight key verses from this project. You should include both the old and new lyrics. In addition to the lyrics, please write a mini-reflection on your new lyrics. Include the verses you've referenced, the original song title and describe how your new lyrics accurately highlight the verses you've selected.
 - <u>Requirements</u>: Your reflection must be one half page and include the old and new song lyrics. It should be appropriately spaced and formatted, size 12 font, Times New Romans.
- 4. Identify another 10 Scripture verses that fit the theme of the verses in the project. Write out each verse and it's Biblical reference. Then reflect on how and why you believe these new verses fit with the theme of the project's verses.
 - <u>Requirements</u>: Your written work must include 3-4 sentences per verse, and the overall written reflection be 1 page, appropriately spaced and formatted, size 12 font, Times New Romans.
- 5. Create an original piece of artwork based on the project verses. In addition to your art piece, write a mini-reflection about how your artwork reflects and/or relates to the Scripture verses provided.

- Requirements: Your reflection must be one half page, appropriately spaced and formatted, size 12 font, Times New Romans.
- 6. Write a devotional based on one or a few of the verses in the project. Your devotional should be original (your own work no copying!) and include the following: verse, personal commentary, and a prayer. Please be sure to include how this verse or verses apply to our life. Please ensure your devotional is formatted with graphics and topic/discussion titles. You may use Pastor Leon's Devoted devotional as a guideline.
 - Requirements: Your devotional must be 1 page, appropriately spaced and formatted, size 12 font, Times New Romans.
- 7. Read the Message Version (MSG) for the verses in the project. Then write a reflection and include the following: How are the translations the same? Different? Give specific examples. Do you feel the Message version captures the essence of these verses? Why or why not?
 - Requirements: Your written work must be 1 page, appropriately spaced and formatted, size 12 font, Times New Romans.
- 8. Choose a song whose theme is similar to that of the verses in the project. Then write a reflection on how the themes are similar and include the song lyrics. Please be specific in addressing how your selected song relates to the Scripture. What made this song stand out for you? Please note that the song you select must be searchable on a digital music streaming service or Youtube. Include the link for the song in your work.
 - Requirements: Your written work must be 1 page, appropriately spaced and formatted, size 12 font, Times New Romans.
- 9. Create a media project with sound and images to bring the Scripture verses to life! Please submit your media project electronically via Google Drive or USB. Please ensure your project is formatted correctly and can be viewed on an Apple MacBook. In addition to your media project, include a short written reflection on your media choices.
 - Requirements: Your written work must be one half page, appropriately spaced and formatted, size 12 font, Times New Romans.
